Saint Joseph


Wednesdays we give special devotion to Saint Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster father of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The little we do know about Saint Joseph comes from the Scriptures, mainly the Gospels of Saint Matthew and Saint Luke. We know that Saint Joseph was a carpenter living in Nazareth, but that he was originally from Bethlehem, the city of David and his decendents. We also know that Joseph is decended of the lineage of King David.

Saint Joesph says not one single word in the Bible! However, the Gospel of Matthew recalls four times the Angel of the Lord speaks to him in dreams and Joseph obeys:

- 1. Matthew 1:20–21 Joseph is told not be afraid to take Mary as his wife because she has conceived Jesus by the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Matthew 2:13 Joseph is warned to leave Bethlehem and flee to Egypt.
- 3. Matthew 2:19–20 while in Egypt, Joseph is told it is safe to go back to Israel.
- 4. Matthew 2:22 Joseph is warned in a dream to depart for the region of Galilee instead of going to Judea.

In the old calendar (Extraordinary Form) there is a Votive Mass of the Saint Joseph, typically said on Wednesdays, though not restricted to only that day. Saint Joseph also has two feast days: 1) March 19th – Saint Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary; and 2) May 1st – Saint Joseph the Worker.

THE LITANY OF SAINT JOSEPH

Under normal circumstances, a *partial indulgence* is granted to those who recite this litany. However, during the Year of Saint Joseph—December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021—this litany has been included among the prayers enriched with a *plenary indulgence*. A plenary indulgence may be earned once a day subject to the usual conditions: sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the Pope, and a total detachment to all sin, including venial sin.
